Sausage Tortellini Soup Recipe

This recipe was offered by Julie Janney, Admissions. She says "It's the best soup ever!" This soup recipe is wonderful on a cold day with crusty French rolls and butter.

- 1 lb. of Hot Italian Sausage (can use regular sausage for a less hot soup)
- 32oz. Chicken Broth
- 2- 14 oz. cans of diced tomatoes
- 1- 10oz. can Rotel (optional)
- 1-8oz. Block of Cream Cheese
- 1-16oz. Bag of Tri Color Tortellini
- 1- Bag frozen chopped spinach

Directions

- 1. Brown the sausage and drain the fat off.
 Add to the sausage the broth, diced tomatoes and Rotel. Bring to a boil and then back off the heat to a simmer and let simmer for 1 hour.
- 2. In one hour of cooking time add cream cheese cut into quarters. Stir until melted. Simmer another hour.
- 3. Add Tortellini and Spinach at the same time, cook until done.
- 4. Serve and Enjoy!
